N.O.S.S.A. CONSTITUTION

1. Reference: Article 7 - Eligibility Add to section 2, subsection (e) - new

NOSSA is committed to providing student-athletes with equal opportunities to participate in school sports consistent with their gender identity. All students have the right and are welcome to play for the sports team or sports activity that best aligns with their gender identity, regardless of their assigned sex at birth. All students may participate in any NOSSA sport, although they may only play on one team in the same sport (team or individual) during a school year. The above statement should be applied in a way that is consistent with OFSAA's vision, mission and values.

2. Reference: Article V – Committees, Meetings and OFSAA Representatives Add new section 6 entitled "Land Acknowledgement"

"NOSSA will begin using Land Acknowledgements at the beginning of in-person events (e.g., Annual General Meeting), gatherings and meetings. NOSSA suggests that host schools use the Land Acknowledgement their school already has in place for their events. It is important to understand that Acknowledgements are culturally contextual and flexible in nature. Schools and event organizers should work with Indigenous guests, community members and their school board to make adjustments as needed. If event organizers have questions regarding the Land Acknowledgement, they are advised to contact the Indigenous Education Leader or FNMI Coordinator within their school board".

Whereas,

OFSAA has a specific process in place that schools must follow in order to "twin" to form sports teams, And whereas,

NOSSA schools must adhere to these requirements if they want to preserve their eligibility to advance to OFSAA Championships,

And whereas,

The current reference in the NOSSA constitution is outdated and does not specify steps that schools must follow to successfully twin,

Be it resolved that,

The exceptions listed under section 4(d) be removed in their entirety and replaced with the following: Add under "Exceptions":

NOSSA schools that enter an official twinning arrangement in accordance with OFSAA By-Law 5, Section 3(b) may combine to form teams.

Add section entitled "Twinning Guidelines and Procedures" as follows:

- 1. Twinning arrangements do not become official within NOSSA until upon confirmation of receipt in writing from the NOSSA Secretary and/or President.
- 2. Twinning arrangements are only in affect for the school year in which they are requested and must be renewed annually to keep them in place.
- 3. Team sports are included in twinning arrangements only not individual sports with a team component.
- 4. The written submission must confirm that:
 - a. the school administration of both schools support the mutual arrangement of coparticipation,
 - b. that smaller of the two schools enrols less than 100 students (240 for football),
 - c. that the smaller of the two schools does not offer the school sport activities in question, and,
 - d. that the two schools involved are the closest schools to one another according to their school addresses.

Change to read as follows: A team playing consecutive games will be given a 30-minute rest between games.

Rationale: Why is basketball in volleyball rules?

7. Volleyball

Reference: Playing Rules – Page 24, sixth section

Reads presently:

Eighteen dressed players shall be allowed to sit on the bench and up to eighteen players may be on the scoresheet.

Change to read as follows:

A team may dress and play a maximum of 17 players for a match. All persons on the bench are considered a part of the team and are liable for any sanctions applicable.

Joanna Castonguay (Renaissance) – JoAnne Gagnon Beauchamp (Renaissance) Action: CARRIED.

Rationale: This falls in line with OFSAA wording. Furthermore, a team consisting of 18 players who qualifies for OFSAA will have to cut 1 player in order to respect the OFSAA rules.

8. Volleyball

Reference: Playing Rules – Page 25, fourth section

Reads presently: All NOSSA volleyball matches must have two (2) officials.

Remove in its entirety.

Joanna Castonguay (Renaissance) – JoAnne Gagnon Beauchamp (Renaissance) Action: CARRIED.

Rationale: There is an Officials Section where this information can be found.

9. Volleyball Reference: Officials – Page 26

Reads presently:

The convener or her appointee(s) shall attempt to arrange for a sufficient number of provincially-rated (OVA) or higher-rated officials so that there will be at least one working each match of the tournament, and two working any final match. The official with the highest rating shall be the referee, not the umpire. At the NOSSA Volleyball Tournaments (A, AA, AAA), the Convener, where possible, must use trained or rated people to serve as lines people.

Change to read as follows:

The convener or the appointee(s) shall attempt to arrange for a sufficient number of certified and registered officials (OVA) so that there will be at least one working each match of the tournament and two working any final match. At the NOSSA Volleyball Tournaments (A, AA, AAA or B), the Convener, where possible, must use trained or certified people to serve as lines people.

Joanna Castonguay (Renaissance) – JoAnne Gagnon Beauchamp (Renaissance) Action: DEFEATED.

Rationale: Changing her to the makes it gender neutral. In volleyball, the referees are certified and must be registered with OVA, they are not rated. In volleyball there is no umpire and if they are all certified it doesn't matter who is the first or second referee. Lines people can be trained or certified, they are not rated and they must be trained for all categories.

10. Volleyball Reference: Schedule, fourth paragraph – Page 27

Reads presently:

When two teams from the same district are involved in one particular NOSSA tournament, that the two teams from that same district play each other in the second round of the tournament (exception: 6 team draw).

Add as follows: If there are two local teams entered, they may be scheduled to play in the first round.

Stephen Beausoleil (Lockerby) – Sherry Green (Lo-Ellen)

Action: CARRIED.

Rationale: There is no advantage of two local teams playing each other in the 1st round. Allowing the two local teams to play each other in the first round provides more time for traveling teams to get to the venue
