#### **NOTICES OF MOTION TO O.F.S.A.A.**

#### 1. Boys Hockey – Eligibility #6: Rules and Officials

Delete in its entirety: If a player is assessed a two (2) minute checking from behind penalty with a game misconduct, that player is ineligible to play for the remainder of that game plus an additional game. A player who is assessed a five (5) minute checking from behind penalty will be ejected for the remainder of that game and the OFSAA championship.

#### N.O.S.S.A. CONSTITUTION

Governing Documents of NOSSA - Motions

On April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023, NOSSA passed a motion to enter a process of review that would render NOSSA ONCA-compliant.

The results of the review process were shared with members with the distribution of the official AGM order paper – available on the NOSSA website at <u>nossa.rainbowschools.ca</u> (Association Info pull down menu, Governance sub-menu).

If NOSSA members adopt the newly proposed By-Laws, they must then also adopt the proposed revisions to the corporation's Articles of Incorporation (to replace the current Letters Patent) to ensure full governmental compliance.

Therefore, there are three formal motions that are required in order to adopt the new proposed governing documents for NOSSA.

The following motions are put forth by the NOSSA ONCA compliance ad hoc committee for Member approval at the Annual Meeting on May  $3^{rd}$ , 2024:

#### 1. Motion #1:

That the NOSSA membership rescinds the current NOSSA Constitution – Articles of NOSSA and replaces them, in their entirety, with the new proposed By-laws as presented to the Members, to become effective as of September 1, 2024.

#### 2. Motion #2:

That the NOSSA membership approves the revisions to its membership categories, membership limitations, membership voting rights, and dissolution terms and approves the Articles of Amendment, for submission to the Government of Ontario and which shall replace the Letters Patent, as presented to the Members.

#### 3. Motion #3:

#### N.O.S.S.A. PLAYING REGULATIONS - COED

#### 1. Badminton – Reference: Scoring – Page 3

In the event of a tie for the aggregate banner awarded, that tie will be broken using points per entry ratio (number of points divided by the number of entries). In the event that it is still a tie, the banner will be awarded to the school with the greatest number of first place finishes or subsequently the number of second place finishes.

Troy Brushett (St Ben's) – Justin Oliver (Lasalle)

Rationale: There was a tie in 2023 for the NOSSA banner. There is nothing in the NOSSA Playing Regs to address this. We did not feel comfortable making a ruling based on our own decided criteria, so we had to have a second banner made to hand out. Both winning schools had two first place finishes and two second place finishes, which is why the ratio should be the first thing considered; less likely to still result in a tie and seems fitting to award the banner to a school that had the same amount points with less athletes.

#### Curling – Reference: Substitution, first and second paragraphs – Page 13

Reads presently: Each team may substitute a maximum of two players at the beginning of an end. Coaches making a substitution should inform the opponent's coach of their intentions.

Delete in its entirety.

Rationale: Redundant.

#### 3. Curling – Reference: Substitution, second paragraph – Page 13

Whereas,

A team with 5 players may substitute their extra player at the beginning of any end throughout the game. Once a player has been substituted, they may not enter back into the same game. However, they are allowed to begin the next game during competition.

And whereas.

Further clarity is needed to the procedure that allows for a team to replace a player in the event of illness or injury during a game.

Be it resolved that this paragraph be removed in its entirety and replaced with the following:

A team with 5 or 6 players may substitute a maximum of two players at the beginning of any end throughout the game. A substituted player may play any position on the team. Once a player has been substituted, they may not enter back into the same game (unless there is an illness or injury to a remaining player). However, they are allowed to begin the next game during competition. Coaches making a substitution should inform the opponent's coach of their intentions.

#### 4. Curling - Reference: General, Item 6 - Page 15

Whereas,

A minimum of 30 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin for choice of practice. The team with last rock will have choice of first or second practice.

And whereas,

Further clarification is needed to add consistency with other rules of play within this document, Be it resolved that

General Item 6 be deleted in its entirety and replaced with: A minimum of 30 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices (thirds) will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin for choice of stone color. The team who chooses top of scoreboard color will have first practice and throw the clockwise turn for their last stone draw (LSD) to determine which team will have last stone in the first end of play. The team who has bottom of the scoreboard color will have second practice and will throw the counter clockwise turn for their last stone draw (LSD) to determine which team will have last stone in the first end of play.

**Rationale:** Adds clarity and consistency with other rules of play within this document.

#### 5. Curling – Reference: General, Item 6 – Page 15

Reads presently: A minimum of 30 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin for choice of practice. The team with last rock will have choice of first or second practice.

Delete in its entirety and replace with: 30 minutes prior to game time, team vices will meet for a coin toss to determine first or second practice, first practice will be top of scoreboard (color), second practice will be bottom of scoreboard (color).

Sean Mullan (West Ferris) – Karienne Montcalm (Chippewa) Action: WITHDRAWN.

**Rationale:** Reflects current practice.

#### 6. Curling – Reference: General, Item 14 – Page 16

Whereas,

Before each team's pool game, after practice, a different player (tracked by the official/convener) shall draw to the button for hammer. The team who practices first shall have their choice of either throwing a clockwise or counter clockwise rotation for their draw to the button. The second team to practice must throw the turn which the first team did NOT throw. That shot shall be measured. The three (3) shots' cumulative score shall be used as a tiebreaker if necessary. The teams shall determine who the three (3) players are. Playoffs will reset the throwers

And whereas,

Further clarification is needed to add consistency with other rules of play within this document, Be it resolved that

General Item 14 be deleted in its entirety and replace with: Before each team's round robin game, after the pre-game practice, a different player (tracked by the official/convener) shall throw their team's last stone draw (LSD) to determine which team will have last stone in the first end of play. The team whose last stone draw (LSD) is closest to the pin (measured in cm) will have last stone in the first end of play. Each team's draw to the button for the round robin games will be measured in cm. A stone covering the button will be measured as zero (0) cm. Stones that are not in the house receive a measurement of 185 cm. The sum in cm of the last stone draws thrown by each team during round robin games shall be used as a tiebreaker if necessary. The teams shall determine who the three (3) players are. Playoffs will reset the throwers.

Add following sentence to paragraph/section 1: Warmups are 7 minutes in length, simultaneous start, and should be run/timed by the official

#### 8. Curling – Reference: General, Item 14 – Page 16

Add the following section:

Tiebreakers for pool play:

- 1-Head-to-head results.
- 2-Shoot-out Last stone draw cumulative scores.
- 3-Prior to the final pool game, if team's shootout last stone draw scores are the same, teams will have their 4<sup>th</sup> player draw to the button. If teams remain tied, players will continue to draw to the button until the tie is broken, using skip-to-lead as the order.

**Rationale:** If teams are tied with three (3) scores of 185 cm (the maximum score), another tiebreaker will potentially be needed.

#### 9. Golf – Series, section D, Page 18

Whereas,

Series D currently reads, "Schools participating in the NOSSA Golf Tournament will be allowed to enter the following formula when entries have to be limited; NIPISSING 4; NORTH SHORE 2; SUDBURY 4; SAULT STE MARIE 4,"

And whereas,

NSSSA has more schools than SSMAA and requests to have a total of 4 entries to align with the other associations

Be it resolved that,

Series D be changed to read: "Schools participating in the NOSSA Golf tournament will be allowed to enter according to the following formula when entries have to be limited: NIPISSING 4; NORTH SHORE 4; SUDBURY 4; SAULT STE MARIE 4"

#### 10. Golf - Series, sections F and H, Page 18

Whereas,

Series H currently reads, "the top 4 individual girls and boys scores from each district may advance to the NOSSA championships,

And whereas,

In series F it currently states that "if a champion from a district meet is not on a team participating at NOSSA, he should be invited to NOSSA by the convenor"

And whereas,

The two series lead to confusion about the number of individual girls and boys, not on a district qualified team, that can advance to the NOSSA championships,

Be it resolved that,

Series F be removed in its entirety and series H be changed to read as follows: "The top four individual girls and boys from each district <u>that placed in the top ten</u> who are not already on a district girls' or boys' team that is advancing to NOSSA may advance to the NOSSA championships".

#### 11. Ski – Alpine – Reference: Entry, section (b), third paragraph – Page 21

Replace "Level I" and "Level II" with "High School" and "Open" respectively.

#### 12. Ski - Alpine - Reference: Rules and Officials - Page 23

Delete reference to F.I.S. in first sentence and change to "O.F.S.A.A.". Will now read as follows: "The O.F.S.A.A. playing regulations shall govern competition at the NOSSA Championship with the following exceptions ..."

#### 13. Ski – Alpine – Reference: Rules and Officials, section f – Page 23

Delete existing section in its entirety and replace with the following: f) A racer must ski off course if forward progress has stopped and race resumption would cause a delay

#### 14. Ski – Alpine – Reference: Equipment – Page 23

Delete in its entirety: All skiers must wear safety straps or ski brakes. It is mandatory that a CSA approved helmet be worn by all racers in the slalom and giant slalom events. Face masks, example - conquest type are acceptable for slalom races only. By the year 2002, a Giant Slalom helmet must be worn for Slalom events.

Replace with the following: "All skiers must wear a CSA approved helmet in accordance with OPHEA and OFSAA regulations".

Remove existing section on Scoring and replace with the following:

- 1. Scoring shall be the result of adding the time of both runs if there are two.
- 2. The person with the fastest total time shall receive 1 point. The person with the second fastest total time 2 points. The person with the third fastest total time 3 points.
- 3. DNF's and DQ's in the first run will receive a second run where applicable.
- 4. DNF's and DQ's shall receive a score which is twice the number of disqualifications or 50% of the total field whichever is greater, added to the last proper score in the event, so long as this result does not displace a team without any DNF's or DQ's.
- 5. DQ's referenced in 3-4-5 above, <u>do not</u> include: DNS (did not start), profanity, unsportsmanlike conduct, other infractions, changed numbers, etc. Such competitors will not be assigned a score.

**Rationale:** Reflects current OFSAA scoring standard, except one amendment which considers the smaller field sizes at the NOSSA competition.

#### 16. Ski - Alpine - Reference: Awards (a) and (b) - Page 24

Section a) Reads presently: Individual (medals) for Level I and II Boys Slalom - 1st Boys Giant Slalom - 1st Boys Combined - 1st Girls Slalom - 1st Girls Giant Slalom - 1st Girls Combined - 1st Total:  $6 \times 2 = 12$  medals (lowest total times break ties) - Change "level I and II" to "high school and open", add 2nds - total becomes  $12 \times 2 = 24$  medals

Section b) Reads presently: Ribbons shall be given out for sixth, fifth, fourth, third and second for Boys' and Girls' Level I and II, Slalom, Giant Slalom and Combined. Total: 12 ribbons for each placing, second to sixth (lowest total times break ties) – Change "level I and II" to "high school and open", remove 2nd place ribbons - total becomes 12 x 4 = 48 ribbons"

#### 17. Snowboarding – Reference: DQ – Page 31

Reference: DQ section – remove in its entirety, change title to "scoring" and replace with the following:

- 1. Scoring shall be the result of adding the time of both runs if there are two.
- 2. The person with the fastest total time shall receive 1 point. The person with the second fastest total time 2 points. The person with the third fastest total time 3 points.
- 3. DNF's and DQ's in the first run will receive a second run where applicable.
- 4. DNF's and DQ's shall receive a score which is twice the number of disqualifications or 50% of the total field whichever is greater, added to the last proper score in the event, so long as this result does not displace a team without any DNF's or DQ's.
- 5. DQ's referenced in 3-4-5 above, <u>do not</u> include: DNS (did not start), profanity, unsportsmanlike conduct, other infractions, changed numbers, etc. Such competitors will not be assigned a score.

#### 18. Track & Field – Reference: General, Section 7 – Page 39

Add as follows: b) i All implements that are brought to NOSSA track and field by individual schools must be checked in by the technical manager prior to the start of the first field events on that day. All implements brought in for evaluation after the start of the first field events on that day (Day 1 or Day 2) will not be allowed to enter competition. (this includes implements brought directly to the respective event)

- b) ii All implements entered in for competition shall remain in the field for all competitors to use for the duration of the day. Implements may only be collected from the technical area on the completion of the entire day's competition, with the following exceptions:
- a. Schools are leaving the venue and are not returning to the venue and the event the implement was used in has been completed in full. The implement in question has been returned to the technical area.
- b. Boys Sr Javelin (800gm), Boys Sr Shot Put (12lb) and Boys Sr Discus (1.6kg), where the school's implement may be retrieved from the technical area after the respective event has been completed in full.

b) iii No item checked in for competition may be removed from the event by a school/participant. All items in the field must be returned to the technical area for tracking purposes.

**Rationale:** The number of checked in implements at track and field is increasing and there continues to be confusion about how and when items may enter and leave the competition field. No motion exists to control the intake and collection of implements at NOSSA Track and Field.

#### 19. Track & Field – Reference: Schedule – Pages 45-47

That the schedule be updated to reflect girls' steeple is now 2000m and midget is now novice.

#### 20. Track & Field - Reference: Schedule - Pages 45-47

That the scheduled time for all track events scheduled to start after the lunch break be moved 15 minutes earlier on day two of the schedule.

**Rationale:** We have been running ahead of schedule for a few years now, and there is a 15min limit to how far ahead of schedule we can proceed. There should still be enough time for a reasonable/suitable break for the track officials, and the meet could potentially finish half an hour earlier.

#### 21. Track & Field – Reference: Track Schedule 800m – Page 46

Currently 8. c) states "800's Should be run with a 1 turn stagger cutting in after 100 metres. Run in 3 boxes on a six lane track. Run in 4 boxes on an eight lane track, with four in each box. The top time from each district assigned to a separate box. The position on staggers will otherwise be drawn by lot by the convener."

Move that 8. c) be replaced with - 800's Should be run with a 1 turn stagger cutting in after 100 metres, run in 2 boxes. Each box of the two boxes will contain two of the top finishers from each district. The position on staggers will otherwise be drawn by lot by the convener.

Rob Van Mierlo (Marymount) – Marc Bertrand (Sacré-Coeur) Action: CARRIED.

Rationale: There are only 16 runners, and they can easily and safely be accommodated in only two boxes. Three or four boxes is complicated for the athletes to understand and difficult for the officials to set up and judge.

#### 22. Track & Field – Reference: Track Schedule 4x100m and 4x400m relays – Page 47

That the 4x100m relays be moved from day 2 to the end of the day 1 schedule (7:30pm start), and further that the 4x400m relays on day 2 move to a 4:15pm start (4pm if motion to move track start times 15 mins earlier passes).

Karen Passi (Lasalle) – Laura Stanyon (Lockerby) Action: CARRIED.

Rationale: Day two currently consists of 100m and 200m heats and finals, as well as 4x100 relays, which is extremely hard on sprinters. During the 2023 NOSSA event, many sprinters started but then walked off one or more of their events to save themselves for later events.

#### 8. Basketball – Reference: AA/AAA Schedule, Page 12

Whereas,

North Bay and the Sault travel the farthest,

And whereas,

The first NOSSA game can start at 1pm,

And whereas,

The current schedule has North Bay and Sault playing at 1pm

Be it resolved that,

Years 2/5/8 – North Bay in Pool A. Sud 2/NS move to A2 and Sault1 move to A3

Years 3/6/9 – Sault in Pool A. Sud2 move to A2 and NDA1 move to A3

#### 2. Football – Reference: General, Page 14

Whereas,

There is no consequence for a player or coach who is ejection from a game.

And whereas,

We want to uphold the OFSAA Code of Conduct.

Other playing regulations have consequences outlined by their sports' governing body.

Be it resolved that,

Any player or coach who is ejected from a NOSSA festival/tournament must serve an additional one game suspension to be served the next league, NOSSA/OFSAA game whichever comes first.

Rationale: It's important to establish 'Top 4' teams in the event one of the top teams cannot

fulfill their obligations, and gives the teams that lose in the Semis something to play for?

#### 4. Soccer – Reference: Entry, Page 21

Add as follows: "After the submission of a region's intent to compete at the NOSSA soccer championship, if a school fails to attend the championship after qualification, it will result in the school's ineligibility for the next year's competition. The school will also be fined the current entry fee for the year they fail to attend".

#### Soccer – Reference: Rules and Officials, Section (a) Length of Play, Page 22

Be it resolved: That the half length for each AA/AAA soccer games at the NOSSA competition be reduced from 40 mins for each half to 30 min in length for each half. (60 min in length for all games – with 2 x 10 min for extra time + penalties, if required for finals games)

Be it also resolved: That the time required to be allotted for each pool game be reduced from 2 hours to 90 min. Also, that the time required between the completion of 1 pool game and the start of that team's next pool game, also be reduced from 2 hours to 90 min for all pool games. 2 hours will remain in place for all final's games (to cater for extra time/penalties, if required

Yves Poirier (Sud Sec) – Paul Hatzis (Lo-Ellen)

Action: CARRIED.

**Rationale:** OFSAA plays 30 min halves. There is little time between NOSSA and OFSAA, where player attrition due to injuries can be high. We make scheduling easier and could potentially reduce the longevity of each day. Potential to alleviate conflicts with grads/proms etc

#### Volleyball – Playing Regulations, Pages 24-27

Whereas,

Sault Ste. Marie now has a boys' volleyball league.

And whereas,

Sault Ste. Marie is ready to host and compete in NOSSA "B" Championships as it is an open event.

And whereas,

Sault Ste. Marie is ready to compete in NOSSA "A" and "AA/"AAA" Championships but is not ready to host these as of yet

And whereas,

The playing regulations could use a cleanup and this information mirrors the Girls' Volleyball playing regulations that were cleaned up last year.

#### **BOY'S VOLLEYBALL PROPOSED PLAYING REGULATIONS (11 pages)**

**AGE & ELIGIBILITY:** See Constitution, ARTICLE VII.

**EVENT DATE:** NOSSA A, AA, AAA, B Volleyball shall schedule the NOSSA Championships either on

the Thursday, Friday or Saturday prior to the OFSAA Championships depending

upon officials' availability.

**TOURNAMENT** 

**FINANCING**:

Expenses for the NOSSA Championships shall be the responsibility of the host district. An entry fee will be charged at the discretion of the convener to off-set tournament expenses. Any profit/loss is to be returned to/covered by the host

district.

**TOURNAMENTS**: NOSSA will host the following tournaments:

"B" Open

"A" Junior/Senior "AA"/"AAA" Junior/Senior

**HOST ROTATION:** 

The rotational order in Boys' Volleyball should be aligned such that one District does not host more than one (1) category in any given year.

The host sites must be confirmed and announced throught the district secretaries one week prior to the championship.

- 1. The "B" tournament shall rotate amongst the four districts.
- 2. The "A" tournament shall rotate amongst shall rotate amongst North Shore, Nipissing and Sudbury until such time that the Sault Ste. Marie District has a junior league and can host both junior and senior divisions.
- 3. The "AA"/"AAA" tournaments shall rotate among Nipissing and Sudbury until such time that the that the North Shore and/or Sault Ste. Marie District wishes to host and/or has a junior league and can host both junior and senior divisions.

#### **ENTRIES:**

"B" and "A" tournaments:

Open "B" - Sudbury (1), Nipissing (1), North Shore (1), Sault (1) Junior "A" - Sudbury (1), Nipissing (1), North Shore (1), Sault (1) Senior "A" - Sudbury (1), Nipissing (1), North Shore (1), Sault (1)

"AA"/"AAA" tournament:

Junior – Sudbury (2), Nipissing (2)

The North Shore district retains the right to (1) one entry, increasing the draw to (5) five teams. A (5) five team draw will only take place if the North Shore district chooses to send a team. Efforts will be made to maintain a (4) four team draw.

In the event that the Sudbury or North Bay district does not commit to sending an entry, the host area will have the opportunity to fill the first vacancy. If there is more than one vacancy, the remaining spots (if any) will be filled by a draw.

Senior – Sudbury (2), Nipissing (2), Sault (2)

The North Shore district retains the right to (1) one entry. Should the North Shore district wish to enter a team, the Sault district will only advance one (1) entry from their district.

#### **DECLARATION:**

By October 31st of the current season, each District must declare, in writing each of the three N.O.S.S.A. conveners, whether or not a district will have an entry in both the senior and junior tournaments. It is not necessary to specify a school. If a district has not declared by the set date, they will not be permitted an entry to the tournament for that year.

#### **ENTRY DEADLINE:**

Each district must declare its specific entrant(s) by the Wednesday prior to the N.O.S.S.A. "B", "A" or "AA"/"AAA" champioships. Failure to do so shall mean forfeiture of the district entrant(s).

#### **FACILITIES:**

The Convener shall make every effort to schedule games on regulation size courts, with height of gym and size of serving area as suggested in the CVA Rules. Teams should be notified in advance of any necessary changes in gym height or serving area size and also if there are any overhead obstructions. This information is to be included in the general information sent to each District well in advance of the tournament. Rulings on overhead obstructions (local ground rules) shall be made by the host district.

#### **FORMAT**:

The "B", "A" and junior "AA/AAA" tournaments shall be a round-robin schedule that shall be played with a final between the first and the second place teams to decide the championship.

The combined "AA"/"AAA" Senior Championship shall be a 6 team - cross pool round robin tournament (2- NDA, 2 - Sudbury, 2- Sault). After round robin play, the top two teams in each pool will play a semi-final game. Winners of the semi-final game will advance to the final. At the conclusion of the senior NOSSA "AA/AAA" Championship Final, the winner will have the opportunity to choose their intent to participate for OFSAA "AA" or "AAA", provided they do not displace a second place team from an OFSAA entry. The second place finisher would then fill the next OFSAA position."

All matches will be the best two out of three games except the senior final, which will be a three out of five games.

A team playing consecutive games will be given a 30-minute rest between games when possible. However, the half hour rest between matches may not be possible due to schedule limitations.

When possible, all participating teams shall play an equal number of matches on the first day of the tournament if the tournament runs on two days.

The Convener is to inform outside districts of the exact time that they are to play their first match, so that travel arrangements can be made. The Convener has the discretion to change the playing schedule when two sites are utilized.

If there are two local teams entered, they may be scheduled to play in the first round.

#### **WARM-UPS**:

Warm-ups will consist of a 5-5-5 format for on court warm-up when the court is made available to the competing teams. Five (5) minutes will be common time for on court warm-up; five (5) minutes for team serving first at net; five (5) minutes for team receiving first at net.

#### **PLAYING RULES:**

The rules used shall be from the most recent CVA rule book with the exception of the ping pong rule.

**PLAYING RULES**: The height of the nets for each division shall be:

Juniors 2.35 m Seniors 2.43 m.

No tensor bandages may be worn on wrists or arms. Elastoplast may be used to tape an injured area; fingers may be taped to protect injured joints. No exposed jewelry to be worn, taping/covering of piercing is allowed. Jewelry such as rings, bracelets and necklaces and any other items deemed unsafe by competition officials shall be removed.

All matches are to be run at the scheduled time unless the teams have not had their prescribed rest period between matches, in which case they shall play later than the scheduled time. If both coaches, the referees and the convener (or the convener's representative) agree to play earlier than the scheduled time, this is acceptable.

A team may dress and play a maximum of 17 players for a match. All persons on the bench are considered a part of the team and are liable for any sanctions applicable.

Junior teams' uniform numbers will not be restricted to the range as outlined in Rule 5.1-4 of the Volleyball Canada Rulebook and the range be allowed from 1 to 99.

Twelve substitutions per set will be permitted as per the Ontario Volleyball's Provincial Indoor Competitions Manual (1997-98).

Clarification: Teams are allowed a maximum of twelve substitutions in any one set. There is no limit to the number of times a player may leave or re-enter a set as long as the maximum number of substitutions is adhered to and they leave or re-enter for the same player. (Once a player has designated substitution partner in a set, that is the only player for which they may leave or re-enter in that set. Players may have a different substitution partner in subsequent sets.)

Should a team member's uniform become soiled due to contact with blood or other bodily fluid, a "substitute uniform" may consist of another team member's uniform or a spare jersey.

Student-athletes must remain fully clothed in an appropriate team uniform in the competition area and use the designated locker room or change area to change to and from competition attire. Teams in violation will receive a yellow card which carries a one point penalty.

#### LIBERO:

Each Team has the right to designate up to two (2) specialist defensive players: Liberos U-5 ii) All Liberos must be recorded on the scoresheet with the team roster. iii) The number of the Libero or Liberos is to be recorded on the lineup sheets for all sets iv) Coach may re-designate Liberos each set v) Only one Libero may be on the court at any time vi) The Libero CAN be either team captain or game captain at the same time as performing as a Libero.

#### **SCORING**:

Tournament - each match won shall earn a team two points, each match lost shall earn a team 0 points.

# VOLLEYBALL CANADA TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:

If two or more teams are tied at the end of the preliminary round, the following critieria will be applied, in order:

- a) The team having the best ratio of won/lost matches, considering matches between the tied teams, will be ranked higher.
- b) The team having the best ratio of won/lost games, considering matches played between the tied teams, will be ranked higher.
- c) The team having the best ratio of won/lost games, considering all matches of the round robin, will be ranked higher.
- d) The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering games played between the tied teams, will be ranked higher.
- e) The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering all games played during the round, will be ranked higher.

When you apply this rule to break a tie you should follow this sequence:

- 1. When two teams are tied, the tie breaking criteria are applied one after the other until the tie has been broken.
- 2. When three or more teams are tied, the tie breaking criteria are applied one after the other until all the tied teams have been ranked.

Note: This means that if there is a tie among teams X, Y and Z and criteria (b) is able to determine X as first, Y as second and Z as third, then no further criteria are to be used. The tie is broken. However, if criteria (b) determines X as first and there is still a tie between Y and Z, then the ranking of the remaining teams will be determined by proceeding to criteria (c) and so on, if necessary. Do not start at (a) again, continue through the sequence of criteria.

#### **OFFICIALS**:

The convener or their appointee(s) shall attempt to arrange for a sufficient number of provincially-rated (OVA) or higher-rated officials so that there will be at least one working each match of the tournament, and two working any final match. The official with the highest rating shall be the referee, not the umpire. Where possible, the convenor must use trained or rated people to serve as lines people.

#### **CONVENER**:

The convener shall appoint a Jury of Appeal consisting of the convener and one representative from each District to rule on any protests that may arise during the course of the tournament. If a member of this Jury is a coach whose team is involved in the protest, another representative will be appointed to assist in the ruling. The convener is reminded to direct coaches to the latest NOSSA Constitution found on the NOSSA website.

**GAME BALL:** 

NOSSA will adopt the same game ball as OFSAA.

**AWARDS**:

Second place teams in Junior and Senior Final matches will be awarded silver medals or second place ribbons.
