Race Statistics:

NOSSA Cross-Country was a successful event in the fact that it ran on schedule to the minute and included, formally in the entrance procedure for the first time and on the schedule - Para Athletes. As well, NOSSA used an electronic entry system and an electronic finish line with the electronic chips located in the bib numbers. The end result of all this being that: 1) Entries were done on the user-friendly site – trackdatabase.com and no problems were reported, and 2) Race results were available immediately after the race (within 1 minute of the final runner crossing the line) and the individual and team results were ERROR FREE! Coaches DID NOT have to collect and submit finishing position numbers for their teams collected by athletes as a verification procedure. We used the same finish line company that we used for OFSAA in 2013 (they provide their own redundant backup timing matt and we put in video cameras at the finish line to record finishing bib numbers looking straight at the finishers and one parallel to the finish line to record finishing order) and if it's good enough for OFSAA, it better be good enough for NOSSA.

Financial information on the cost of using the electronic systems can be found on the financial report but it must be noted that although expensive, the costs WERE NOT prohibitive! With the amount of money brought in through registration, there was enough funds remaining after the costs of the finish line and the registration to fund the rest of the meet.

All of the feedback on the Registration and the timing was positive. Several coaches expressed that they were very pleased that they knew where their registration money was being spent!

A good NOSSA XC Information package has been established that could be used as a template for the NOSSA XC packages in the future. It is attached (without the course maps).

As well there have been a number of changes at the OFSAA level to the wording of athlete ages, race distance allowances and wording around the inclusion of Para Athletes. I've included a number of motions to bring NOSSA back in line with what was currently worded. The other motions: schedule change and recommendation to use electronic timing are included in the attached document with a rationale.

Postscript:

In April of 2017 OFSAA changed the race distances for both genders to bring a measure of equality, thereby closing the gender gap. At OFSAA XC 2017, Midgets (Girls and Boys) will race 4 km, Juniors (Boys and Girls) will race 5 km and Seniors (Boys and Girls) will race 6 km.

I recommend NOSSA accept these new race distances and implement them for 2017.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO NOSSA XC PLAYING REGS

1. Cross-Country Running Reference: Ages – Coed Playing Regulations page 6

Whereas: The NOSSA age categories currently state:

AGES: Midget : under 15 on December 31st of the competing year.

Junior : under 16 on December 31st of the competing year.

Senior : under 20 on December 31st of the competing year.

And Whereas: The age categories used to reflect the categories as stated by OFSAA

And Whereas: OFSAA has updated its current age classifications

Be it resolved that the age categories from OFSAA Cross-Country Running be adopted by NOSSA to read as follows:

AGES:

(a) Competition shall be conducted in three age classifications:

(i) Senior: the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her 19th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held;

(ii) Junior: the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her 15th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held;

(iii) Midget: the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her 14th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held. Students may compete in this category for one year only in Grade 9.

2. CROSS-COUNTRY RUNNING

Reference: Schedule – Coed Playing Regulations page 7

Whereas,

The current regulations state:

The schedule of events will run as follows:

And whereas,

At this year's NOSSA Senior Girls race 23% of the field finished after 28 minutes of time had elapsed including several after more than 30 minutes.

And whereas,

This leaves little time for coaches to have an opportunity to support all their finishing athletes and get to the start line to support their Senior Boys.

And Whereas,

The Para Race has become a fixture on the schedule but are not included in the Constitution.

Be it resolved that the following schedule be adopted:

SCHEDULE:

11:30am	Midget	Girls
11:32 am	Para	
12:00pm	Midget	Boys
12:30pm	Junior	Girls
1:00pm	Junior	Boys
1:45pm	Senior	Girls
2:30 pm	Senior	Boys

Rationale: The 11:32 start time for the Para race allows the Para athletes to have their own start line for their race as with all other age categories yet allows them to have company on the course even with the small Para fields at NOSSA.

3. CROSS-COUNTRY RUNNING Reference: Courses – Coed Playing Regulations page 7

Whereas,

The current playing regulations state:

The host District must conform as closely as possible to the suggested O.F.S.A.A. Distances.

And whereas,

OFSAA has updated their regulations for course distance.

Be it resolved that;

The course distances be updated to the current OFSAA regulations and be re-worded as follows:

Approximate distance to be covered by each runner in each classification is as follows:

Midget Girls' 3000m Junior Girls' 4000m Senior Girls' 5000m Para Event 3000m Midget Boys' 5000m Junior Boys' 6000m Senior Boys' 7000m

4. CROSS-COUNTRY RUNNING Reference: Rules of Competition – Coed Playing Regulations page 7

Whereas,

The current playing regulations state:

RULES OF COMPETITION:

- 1. The starter should VISUALLY inspect the field before the start of the race to ensure that all competitors are in respect of the uniform. requirements.
- 2. All races must be started by a starting pistol.
- 3. A "Funnel" system must be used at the finish of the race.
- 4. Finishing cards must be issued to every competitor who completes completes the course.
- 5. At least one finishing judge must be at the head of the finishing funnel.
- 6. The course must be clearly marked by stakes, flags, paint, etc. and/or marshalls. Marshalls should wear distinctive marking of some type. No runner may run in more than one race.
- 7. That no more than two runners from any one team may run side by side.
- 8. Runners may not use any Personal Electronic Devices (PED's) during competition.

Be it resolved that the regulations be re-worded as follows:

RULES OF COMPETITION:

1. The starter should VISUALLY inspect the field before the start of the race to ensure that all competitors are in respect of the uniform requirements.

- 2. All races must be started by a starting pistol.
- All races SHOULD use an electronic timing system in which each individual runner's performance is measured electronically. If an electronic system is used:
 I there must be a backup system in place to record times and places
 II a visual recording of the finishing order utilizing cameras is recommended as an emergency backup to the electronic timing systems.
- 4. If an electronic system is not being used (see #4 #5): A "Funnel" system must be used at the finish of the race.
- 5. Finishing cards must be issued to every competitor who completes the course.
- 6. At least one finishing judge must be at the head of the finishing funnel.
- 7. The course must be clearly marked by stakes, flags, paint, etc. and/or marshalls. Marshalls should wear distinctive marking of some type.
- 8. No runner may run in more than one race.
- 9. That no more than two runners from any one team may run side by side.
- 10. Runners may not use any Personal Electronic Devices (PED's) during competition.

Rationale: The cost for Electronic timing systems have dropped in recent years and the use of these systems should eliminate most of the issues that have arisen from races where they haven't been used (finishing order mistakes, team point totals disputes, etc.)

5. CROSS-COUNTRY RUNNING New Regulation:

Whereas,

There have been no regulations in regards to the Para Race for the NOSSA XC Championships.

And whereas,

The Para race is now a fixture on the schedule,

And whereas,

The OFSAA XC Playing Regulations for the Para race have been updated,

Be it resolved that;

The NOSSA Playing regulations for the Para race reflect the current OFSAA regulations where appropriate. The modified rules be added as follows:

Co-Ed Combined Para Cross Country Race

QUALIFICATION STANDARDS – Playing Regulations The following expectations must be met for an athlete to be eligible to compete in the

Para division at the NOSSA Championship:

a) A Para athlete is an individual that due to physical and / intellectual disability is at a disadvantage to compete in an able-bodied race.

b) All Para athletes must attend team practices.

c) Para athletes are expected to compete at a race/s throughout the season prior the NOSSA Championships.

d) Para athletes with an intellectual classification (T/F 20), must not have attained their 21st birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held.
e) All other Para athletes are only eligible to compete at NOSSA for 5 years (as per able-bodied athletes).

f) All athletes in the Para Race will receive a finisher's ribbon. There will not be an **official** NOSSA winner in this race until such time as a fair classification system is in place. The top 6 individual finishers in this combined event may receive an award (as the other categories at NOSSA do).

g) Coaches are asked to submit the OFSAA PARA XC Athlete Information Form for all athletes wishing to compete at NOSSA prior the Registration deadline. This allows the NOSSA Convenor the opportunity to be made aware of all athletes that will be participating. Para athletes must only be registered online IF these forms are submitted.

RACE DESCRIPTION

- The NOSSA Para Race be run as a Co-Ed Combined Cross-Country Race

- For safety reasons, Para athletes who require a guide MUST bring their guide, a parent, coach or supervisor during their pre-race walk

GUIDES

- 1. To ensure athlete safety, Para athletes can use a guide.
- 2. Guides must meet the volunteer standards set out by their local school.

3. Where required, athletes MUST provide their own guide.

3. Due to issues of liability, safety and privacy **NO individual personal guides will be** provided by the NOSSA Cross Country Organizing Committee.

4. According IPC standards, coaches and their guides should review pages 42 and 43 of the <u>IPC</u> <u>Athletics Rules and Regulations 2011 – 2012, Giving Assistance – Guide Runner and Method</u> <u>of Guidance</u>, sections # 3, #4, #6, #7, #8.

Course: All races will primarily be run along the hard-packed dirt cart paths that encircle the course. Mixed in will be the occasional grassy stretch. The course will be well-flagged with directional arrows indicating the various loops. Marshals will be located at critical areas around the course. The start line will be along the fairway of the 5th hole. The finish line will be located directly behind the starting line along the 4th hole fairway.

Registration: Early registration will take place from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm on Tuesday, October 25th. The course will be open at that time for course walks. Registration will take place in the clubhouse.

Para Athlete Registration: Athletes competing in the Para category are to be registered online and coaches are asked to submit the <u>NOSSA XC PARA AND GUIDE INFORMATION FORM</u> to the Convenor via fax or email prior to the Registration deadline. This form is a modified version of the one on the OFSAA website. Coaches of athletes moving on to OFSAA **MUST COMPLETE AND SUBMIT** the information form for their Para athletes. The OFSAA PARA GUIDE AND INFORMATION FORM is available here:

www.ofsaa.on.ca/cross-country-running/coaches/registration.

Facilities: Portable toilets will be available at the golf club. There are no changerooms, if athletes need changerooms, they may use the rooms available at Espanola High School. Food and drinks will be for sale the day of the meet. NOSSA shirts will be for sale with prices posted as soon as we know.

Awards: NOSSA medals will be given to the 1st seven finishers on the 1st place team in each category, as well as to the 1st place individual in each category. The 1st seven finishers on the 2nd and 3rd place teams, as well as the 2nd through 6th individuals in each category will receive ribbons. Banners will be presented to Girls' Aggregate, Boys' Aggregate, and Overall Aggregate. Please return any trophies to the Officials' Building during registration.

Uniforms: Runners must compete in their school uniforms. Uniform tops must be identical. No music player devices may be worn (no ipods, MP3's etc.) Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification. Spikes are recommended.

OFSAA Entries:

Who qualifies?: The top 2 teams in each age category and the top 5 individuals not on a qualifying team earn entry to OFSAA. A team may enter 6 athletes for the OFSAA race but may only run 5 individuals. The athletes must meet OFSAA age and eligibility requirements as stated in the constitution.

How to enter?: Entries of teams and individuals must be made through the NOSSA Convenor on Wednesday October 27th before you leave the site. Coaches must have all necessary OFSAA forms, signatures and fees with them before OFSAA entry will be accepted.

OFSAA FEES: \$16 / athlete payable to ESPANOLA HIGH SCHOOL. OFSAA charges a participant fee of \$3 per athlete entered, OFSAA Cross-Country Running charges a race fee of \$13 per athlete entered.

PROBLEMS

- The draw seems to be the on-going challenge with NOSSA curling. The Modified Double Elimination and the rules specified for number of games played in one day has been a problem for many years. A motion has been brought forth to have this event extend to three days as previous conveners, coaches and teacher reps cannot recommend a better draw to accommodate the number of entries and the approved playing regulations.
- Teams paid for but did not attend the banquet. This was disappointing to the school and organizers.
- There were media reports of a trophy, the Imperial Esso Dealer's Trophy, being won by the boys' team, but as convenor I was not aware that a trophy even existed. If there is one, it should be available for presentation at the awards ceremony.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. NOSSA should strive to have playing regulations be in line with OFSAA playing regulations in all aspects.
 - This will make it easier for the competitors to move from one competition to the next with no variation in the playing regulations.
 - There was discussion amongst some Coaches that schools are pooling their players as many curlers go on School trips to Europe during the time NOSSA curling event is held- this is not in accordance with OFSSA rules.
- Use of the information format that was created by Ryan Lafraniere for this year's NOSSA curling event be used forthcoming. It is precise and easy to find the needed information.
- 3. All Associations have their league play concluded and winners determined a minimum of 1 week prior to the start date of NOSSA.
 - This will allow for "Snow Days" and other unforeseen circumstances.
 - Allows the Convener of the event to have the draw done and other information sent out to participants in a timely manner.
- 4. All eligible teams <u>must</u> at the time of registration, bring or have sent in their AELS forms and registration fees.
- 5. Rented curling clubs are requested to have a designated area, away from the youth curlers, for parent/spectator alcohol consumption. This worked wonderfully this year. It prevented the spectators from making unruly comments to coaches and curlers.
- 6. Code of Conduct for Coaches and Athletes should be provided to teams and posted in clubs during the NOSSA Curling competition.
- 7. Code of Behaviour for Spectators should be provided to teams and posted in clubs during the NOSSA Curling competition. (see attached...can be amended)

- 8. Use scoresheets. This was very helpful this year in recording scores on line. It also provides both teams and convener with proof of eligible players and final scores. (This year we used SDSSA score sheets)
- **9. Support those who prepare and organize the Banquet.** This year several teams paid but did not show up to support the Life Skills Students who put on the banquet at LoEllen Park Secondary. Food was prepared for all those who indicated that they would attend-therefore there was a lot of waste.

10. In lieu of extending NOSSA curling to a 3 day event, the NOSSA Executive should look at changing the Modified Double Elimination draw to a Round Robin Pool Play (RRPP) draw.—see outline below

- Reason: Playing regulation # 15 states "Teams must not be required to play more than three games in on calendar day of competition." This year the Lockerby Composite Girls' team played 4 games due to only having 1 loss. This situation will not occur with a RRPP.
- No extra time would have to be given to the teams in question for a break between games. i.e. The way the draw is set up now, the team with one loss has to play 4 consecutive games in a row adding up to 8 or more hours on the ice with minimal time for breaks and ice maintenance. It also puts the waiting team at a disadvantage for having to wait until their opponent has been determined. (a 2 day event MDE draw creates this problem)
- This would allow for the Consolation round to be played if the club being rented has 6 sheets available.
- This would allow the Curling Club to allow their league play to continue in the evening. NOSSA curling does not generate a lot of money for the club which is being rented due to low /zero alcohol sales and participants who choose not to support the club by purchasing their meals there.



Recommendations:

The tournament ran smoothly at both gym locations without any incidences. Final were played at both gyms. I would recommend that all finals be played at the gym where the awards are to be presented to allow all teams to be able to watch and encourage their peers.

Playing regulations updates – recommendations from the post-event coaches meeting

- 1. Breaks between matches
 - a. Current playing regulations states that 5 minutes between matches. It is recommendation that 90 seconds be allowed between matches.
 - i. Rational: 5 minutes is too long.
 - b. It is current practice that players switch sides at 11 points in the event of a 3rd game. Coaching may also occur at this time (only in 3rd game). It is recommended that this be indicated in the playing regulations as it has been in practice.
 - i. Rational: to keep playing regulation clear, concise and up to date.
 - c. Water breaks at 11 points in all games. It is recommended that this indicated in the regulations
 - i. Rational: too many water breaks may alter the flow of the game.
 - d. It is recommended that NOSSA badminton playing regulations uniform item be amended to include the following; shorts must be above the knee and no spandex permitted.
 - i. Rational: this amended is designed to eliminate basketball style short and spandex apparel that are not permitted at OFSAA level. This will bring NOSSA in line with OFSAA playing regulations.
 - e. Current points scoring is as follows;

1st- 5 points, 2nd- 4 points, 3rd - 3 points, 4th - 2 points, 5th 1 - point

It is recommended that the points scoring be revised as follows;

 $1^{st} - 5$ points, $2^{nd} - 3$ points, $3^{rd} - 1$ point

i. Rational: As schools in all regions get smaller, this will level the playing field in terms of overall points. It will also give more value to those earning medals.

1. Under Series letter a)

Currently States:

Two entries will be allowed from each area. If one area does not enter two teams, the host area may supply an additional entry. A competitor may enter one event only. This vacant spot in the draw shall be filled by the individual or team who has placed next in the host district's standings.

Change To:

Two entries will be allowed from each district for each event. A competitor may enter one event only. If one district does not submit two entries, the host district may supply an additional entry to fill the vacant spot in the draw using the individual or team who has placed next in the host district's standings.

Rational:

Change in the word area to district for better clarification.

2. Under Rulebook:

Currently States:

Canadian Badminton Association. A convener's book was prepared in 1976 and will be passed on to the next convener.

NOSSA badminton will return to the current OFSAA playing regulations in all matters pertaining to format of competition, protective equipment and brand of shuttlecock to use.

Change To:

Badminton Canada – Laws of Badminton 2012 (<u>http://www.badminton.ca/page/27820/Rules-of-the-Game</u>)

NOSSA badminton will return to the current OFSAA playing regulations in all matters pertaining to format of competition, (other than we have a true double elimination tournament), protective equipment and brand of shuttlecock to use.

Rational:

A few things have changed since 1976 we have a different format of competition – true double elimination – we don't guarantee 4 games but rather two.

3. Under Officials

Currently states:

Staff members, coaches and players (no payment).

Change To:

Staff members, coaches and players will be used for line calls, score keepers, timers and draw desk (no payment).

• Also move this section of "Officials" to be after "Format" and before "Judges"

Rational:

It clarifies the difference between officials and judges and what they can be used for and that is why they should also be next to each other in the regulations.

4. Under Format Letter a)

Currently states:

A true double elimination tournament as used at OFSAA. This guarantees everyone 2 matches. The finalist from the losers round must defeat the winner round finalist in 2 matches in order to win.

Change to:

A true double elimination tournament. This guarantees everyone 2 matches. The finalist from the losers round must defeat the winner round finalist in 2 matches in order to win.

Rational:

Removing the "as used at OFSAA" because OFSAA does not run a true double elimination tournament.

5. Under Format Letter b) iii)

Currently states:

Players shall be allowed a rest period of no more than 90 seconds between consecutive games.

Change to:

Players shall be allowed a rest period of no more than 120 seconds between consecutive games.

Rational:

At the OFSSA level they have 120 seconds.

6. Under Format Letter c)

Currently states:

With 10 to 12 courts available, the following timings and order of events may be used: i) Tournament begins with all singles matches to finals – planning time 4 hours. ii) Doubles to the finals - 4 and a half hours.

iii) Mixed doubles starting 1 hour after doubles - 3 and one half hours.

Change to:

It is recommended to have a minimum of 10 to 12 courts available for NOSSA badminton tournament.

Rational:

We have not run NOSSA in this order for years. This is wording from when players could play in multiple draws. However, a guideline of the number of courts required to host the event should remain.

7. Under Format Letter f)

Currently states:

Games one to eight in each draw are to be played on the Friday evening.

Change to:

Games one to eight in each draw are to be played on the first day of the event.

Rational:

If for some reason we do not play NOSSA on a Friday/Saturday the wording of the regulations should be flexible to accommodate this.

8. Under Format Letter h)

Currently states:

Players switch sides at 11 points in the event of a 3rd game. Coaching may also occur at this time (only in 3rd game).

Change to:

Players switch sides at 11 points in the event of a 3rd game. Coaching may also occur at this time (only in 3rd game) for 60seconds. NOTE: This is different from Laws of Badminton but it is something NOSSA coaches have requested based on being able to give their players feedback to help them learn.

Rational:

The time was not specified and this has been the agreed upon length of time amongst the coaches.

9. Under Trophies

Currently States:

The following team trophies shall be presented at the conclusion of the NOSSA competition: (a) The Steve Chen Trophy - Combined Team Champion

- (b) The Bumbacco Trophy Senior Team Champion
- (c) The Larry Bobbie Trophy Midget Team Champion
 - Junior Team Champion
- (e) The Lucio Fabris Trophy Overall District Winner

Change To: Subheading Change from Trophies to "Awards"

The following awards shall be presented at the conclusion of the NOSSA competition:

- (a) The Larry Bobbie Trophy Midget Team Champion
 - i. The school team with the highest number of points in all Midget draws.
- (b) The Jim Muchmore Trophy Junior Team Champion
 - i. The school team with the highest number of points in all junior draws.
- (c) The Bumbacco Trophy Senior Team Champion
 - i. The school team with the highest number of points in all Senior draws.
- (d) The Steve Chen Trophy And the Aggregate Banner
 - i. The school team with the highest number of points combined across all 3 divisions (Midget/Junior/Senior).
- (e) The Lucio Fabris Trophy Overall District Winner
 - i. The district with the highest number of points combined across all 3 division (Midget/Junior/Senior).

Rational:

It clarifies that the combined team champions win the trophy and the aggregate banner and it was missing the name for the junior trophy.

10. Under Uniforms

Currently: There are no letters to outline each point

Change: Please add letters for each item a) b)

Rationale: Easier to refer to the changes in the future

11. Under Uniforms

Currently:

All players must be dressed in gym shorts of mainly solid colour and a predominantly white T-shirt (or white collared shirt) - No fluorescent colours. Shorts must be above the knee and no spandex permitted.

School, Association or OFSAA logos are permitted insignia in the competitive area. The brand name of the uniform manufacturer is permitted to be visible. Badminton-related shirts are acceptable.

School team badminton uniforms are accepted. The shirts do not have to be white if the singles player or matching double/mixed partners are wearing matching team uniforms. Doubles and mixed players from the same team must wear matching, solid coloured shorts.

Headgear is not acceptable in the competitive area with the exception of sweat bands.

When two or more players are warming up or competing on court, approved eye-wear is mandatory for all levels of NOSSA badminton.

Change to:

a) "The NOSSA Badminton dress code will follow the OFSAA Badminton dress code as outlined in section 7(a) and (b) of the OFSAA Badminton Playing Regulations."

Rationale:

To align our dress code with OFSSA so that our players are prepared for the expectations at the next level of play.

12. Under Uniforms

Currently states:

When two or more players are warming up or competing on court, approved eye-wear is mandatory for all levels of NOSSA badminton.

Change To:

b) When anyone is on a court, warming up (including coaches), or competing, approved eye-wear is mandatory for all levels of NOSSA badminton.

NOTE: A coach does not need to wear goggles to go onto the court to coach during the match.

Rational:

Insurance will not cover any injury to any person.

13. <u>Under Draws</u> Currently states:

There is a mock draw drawn in.

Change To:

The host district may use the approved spreadsheet file that has been created for this event to create all of the draws and calculate all of the points. Please see previous convener for a copy of the file.

Rational:

Many hours have been spent on creating this spread sheet and it has proven to be very effective.
