Convenor Comments:

- One hundred and eleven (111) athletes participated in NOSSA Nordic this year, including two para nordic (standing) athletes. Last NOSSA hosted by NDA in 2019 had 92 athletes.
- 3 athletes participated from North Shore schools this year.
- Thank you to the other NDA coaches for your assistance in running this event.

Convenor Recommendations:

- Changes to NOSSA Playing Regulations needed. See below. What is the process to get these changes addressed?
- Future convenors should contact coaches of para nordic athletes to ensure a race course that suits the abilities of the para nordic athletes. A relatively easy course of 3km was recommended by coaches this year. The 3km Purple trail at the North Bay Nordic Club was used for the para Nordic skiers.

Changes to NOSSA Nordic Playing Regulations

- References to trophies? To my knowledge, these have not been awarded in the past few years. Are they still to be awarded and if so, where are they?
- There is no language in the NOSSA playing regulations regarding paranordic categories. This will need to be added in the future. In the most recent OFSAA Nordic playing regulations, paranordic and special needs categories are listed as a demonstration event. Do we consider awarding NOSSA medals to para Nordic skiers, or do we refer to it as a demonstration event?
- Language needs to be improved regarding what constitutes a qualifying team. After discussion with some coaches, the following was agreed upon for this event. This wording should be revisited.

Team Qualification: For teams with more than five skiers in a category (i.e. junior boys), the top 5 skiers from the NOSSA results for that school will automatically be designated as Team A, unless a coach/school declares their A and B athletes prior to NOSSA by contacting the convenor prior to the registration deadline. If a school has enough skiers to field a full Team B, that Team B will be eligible to qualify for OFSSA if they are the second place team based on NOSSA results.

2 - Problems the year

There were no problems encountered this year. The Alpine Community is a wonderful group of dedicated volunteers who work as a team to make this championship a great success.

The NOSSA Alpine community may wish to examine the parameters by which points are earned and not earned in this event and reflect upon what subsequent (if any) potential updated programming instructions the computer program receive in order to figure out individual and team champions and placements.

3. Recommendations for Next Year

I recommend that the coaches continue to have a conversation during the morning meeting to talk about the option of doing a second run of slalom, without a course re-set and without a subsequent full course inspection. A safety inspection by chief of course would occur, any small changes made, and the course crew would repair the course as needed. If it is the wish of the coaches, using this procedure saves a lot of time and helps to get two runs of slalom in a quicker fashion. Protests would follow both runs, and bib order would remain the same for both runs.

NOSSA Swimming regulations

1-SERIES:

a-The series NOVICE should be removed.

Why? There is no NOVICE category in swimming. (This was removed by Sudbury conveners since there is no Novice category at OFSAA).

ENTRIES :

a-SHOULD DELETE:

Entries will be accepted from the district convener only.

Why? This does not apply. Each school sends the convener their entries.

b-SHOULD READ:

Competitors may enter up to three (3) events; two (2) of which may be individual events.

Why? This has ALWAYS been the regulation.

c-SHOULD DELETE:

However, only a maximum of two (2) swimmers per any school per event may advance to finals.

Why? Since all events at NOSSA are timed finals.

d-SHOULD ADD:

All entries must be accompanied by a time to ensure that seeding is done properly.

Why? Some swimmers are trying to get the OFSAA qualifying time. This would ensure the best chances for these swimmers to achieve this goal. Having the seeding done according to times assures that is done instead properly instead of having the computer randomly place everyone with no time.

Entries will be accepted from the district convener only. Competitors may enter up to four (4) events; three (3) of which may be individual events. Each school may place an unlimited number of entries in any event if the swimmers meet the requirement of the category. However, only a maximum of two (2) swimmers per any school per event may advance to the finals. In the event that there are eight swimmers or less, all swimmers advance to the final round.

e-SHOULD ADD:

INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES:

When an 'Individual' event is designated as age group, only swimmers in that age group shall be eligible to compete in that event.

A swimmer may only compete in that swimmer's own age group. If an event is not offered in that swimmer's age group, the swimmer may enter that same event in the senior category, should it be offered in the meet program.

*(In a meet where both age-group and senior events are offered, an age group swimmer may swim in either section, but not a combination; except that when the swimmer is entered in the age-group competition, the swimmer may also swim in senior events that are not offered in the swimmer's age group.)***NOT SURE IF THIS APPLIES TO US.**

RELAY ENTRIES:

In age-group relays, one (1) or two (2) swimmers may be from a younger age group. In such cases, the swimmer(s) may swim in both their own age-group relay as well as in one or more older age-group relays.

Why? These are the rules found in the Swimming Canada Guide. There were many questions regarding these regulations during our entries last year. I have found these regulations and I believe these need to be added to our regulations to ensure that they are properly followed.

Examples: This would avoid a junior swimmer deciding to swim in the senior race since they are faster than the fastest senior.

This would avoid a Senior Relay being composed of only 1 senior and 3 juniors.

3-AWARDS:

a-SHOULD BE LOOKED AT AND DECIDED:

Nothing is indicated regarding RIBBONS. This year I was told that ribbons had to be given from 3rd to 8th place. This had never been done in previous years. Ribbons were given from 3rd to 5th place since the pool had 5 lanes. I think it should be indicated in the regulations what should be done for the ribbons.

Individual – NOSSA medallions shall be presented to the first two (2) finishers in each event.

b-SHOULD BE REMOVED:

Team-Banners will be presented to the Boys team scoring the highest numbers of points in the meet and the Girls team scoring the highest number of points in the meet.

Why? This is not done.

SHOULD BE REPLACED BY:

Team-Banners will be presented to the A team scoring the highest numbers of points in the meet and the AA team scoring the highest number of points in the meet.

Why? This is what is done.

Team - Banners will be presented to the Boys team scoring the highest number of points in the meet. and the Girls team scoring the highest number of points in the meet.

a-SHOULD BE REMOVED b) i), c), d) and e)

- (c) The above scoring system will be used to determine team awards.
Individual awards will be determined by the first, second and third place finish.

Recommendations: The event ran smoothly and it was great to be able to host for the first time at Elliot Lake Secondary School. The date change due to strike action worked out. During the coached meeting there was much discussion about interpretations of the some of the rules laid out in the NOSSA Regs. From what we heard from coaches and referees came the following recommendations;

Recommendation One

Referees cannot be coaches. Coaching means providing any instruction or strategy during a match or between matches. The two roles cannot overlap during the competition. If a referee coaches an athlete, the convener will follow the steps outlined below. Referees are permitted to answer safety questions and discuss rules with athletes.

Step One

Warn the referee

Step Two

Ask the referee if they want to referee, or coach. Tell them that a third infraction will result in being removed from having any role, referee or coach, at the competition.

Step three

If a third infraction occurs, the referee will be not be permitted to continue refereeing or coach for the remainder of the competition. The referee will lose their pay and per diems commensurate with the time of the infraction and the end of the competition.

Recommendation Two

Two weigh ins take place, each one hour in duration. The first the night before the event, and the second, the day of the event. Once athletes step on the official weigh in scale, they must wrestle at that weight. They only get one shot at the scale the night before and only one shot at the scale the morning of.

A practice scale will be set up and available for athletes. If there is a difference between the practice scale and the official scale, the official scale will be used as the standard to determine the athletes weight class.

Recommendation Three

Referees will be paid the day of the event by cheque. An invoice for referee costs must be submitted to the convener at least three days prior to the event.

Referee Costs

The standard rate of pay for the event, for each referee and the paring master will be \$150. The head referee will receive \$175. This cost can be changed each year, if required, by the committee.

For referees travelling over 100 KM

Meals and hotel expenses will be paid by the convening school for travelling referee costs. The meal rate will be \$75 per day as a per diem. The meal rate will not require meal receipts from the referees. If the host school is providing lunch on the day of the event, the per diem rate will be \$50. If the host school is providing breakfast and lunch, the per diem will be \$25. If the host school is providing all three meals, there will no per diem provided. The per diem rate the day the referees travel to the event will depend on the meals they require. Referees will also be paid a km rate (the same as the current board km rate). Every effort will be made to car pool to reduce costs.

Recommendation Four

Each event will require a paramedic, nurse or First Aid trained person for a first aid table on site.

Problems and Recommendations:

- 1) Due to the workplace labor situation, we had to find an alternative time to host that would: 1) permit time for winning teams to declare for OFSAA, and 2) not conflict with a strike/potential strike day, and compromise our teacher/coaches ability to fulfil their commitment as a coach and also as a member of their respective Union.
- 2) A second challenge was getting confirmation of teams for the event and/or determining who is attending. Part of this challenge was due to regions having to play games that were cancelled earlier on in their local season due unforeseen circumstances (weather/strike days)

In both cases mentioned above, it was just the unusual landscape that we were in this year that accounted for some last minute planning/rescheduling.

- 3) **Trophies:** neither the junior nor senior boy's NOSSA Trophies could be located. I went through past winners on NOSSA website and called schools with no success.

Recommendations:

- 1) I would suggest that once a team/school wins the right to represent their region, that the school's athletic director and/or coach e-mail the convenor of that event (as all convenor information can be found on the NOSSA activity calendar) and cc their local



convenor to declare their intent to 'attend' or 'not attend'. The sooner the respective school declares this, the sooner the NOSSA convenor can reach out to other regions/schools to find an alternative rep.

- 2) Have each NOSSA A' school's athletic director verify that the NOSSA A' championship trophy is not in their possession. If they are not found, then replacements should be purchased.

Playing Regulations Update:

Deletions:

General: 6. A minimum of 30 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin for choice of last rock or rock colour. The team with last rock will have first practice.

Rationale: this rule will be replaced with the rules under **Modifications.**

General: 9. The C.C.A. rules regarding the “Free Guard Zone” will be in effect for both Boys’ and Girls’ playdowns.

Rationale: under Rules, it has already been stated that the Curling Canada playing regulations are being used and this is part of the Curling Canada playing regulations.

General: 10. A Consolation draw involving teams knocked out of the Championship draw in rounds 1 and 2 will be played if there is time and facilities available (see below).

Rationale: this rule was pertinent when the format was a modified double knockout. The format has been changed to pool play and teams are guaranteed 3 games. There is no need or time for a consolation round.

General: 11. Awards (ribbons) shall be provided to the Consolation Champions.

Rationale: if rule 10 is deleted then there is no need for rule 11.

Modifications:

General: 17. Determination Of Hammer In The First End Of Games

i) If there is sufficient time in the schedule to allow for practice before each game:

A minimum of 30 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin to choice of practice (first or second) or rock colour. Practice will be seven minutes duration.

Before each team's pool game, after practice, a different player (tracked by the official/convener) shall draw to the button for hammer. That shot shall be measured. The three (3) shots' cumulative score shall be used as a tiebreaker for playoff positions if necessary. The teams shall determine who the three (3) players are. Playoffs will reset the throwers.

The team practicing first will deliver the clockwise turn. The team practicing second will deliver the counter clockwise turn. Full sweeping is allowed. The team with the better draw distance will receive last stone advantage in the first end.

ii) If there is insufficient time in the schedule to allow for practice before each game:

A minimum of 15 minutes prior to game time, the opposing vices will meet behind the glass of their designated sheets to toss a coin for choice of last rock or rock colour.

After each team's first pool game there will be a shootout in which each team member will throw one draw to the button (either turn). Full sweeping is allowed. Each draw will be measured and recorded. The four (4) shots' cumulative score shall be used as a tiebreaker for playoff positions if necessary.

Additions:

General: 18. Tie Breaking Procedure:

1. If two (2) teams are tied for a playoff position, the winner of the game in pool play between the tied teams shall receive the position.

2. If three (3) teams are tied and one team has defeated all the other tied teams during pool play, it shall receive the position.
3. To determine the additional playoff positions the measurements from the pool play games draw to the button shall be used with the lowest score(s) receiving the position(s).
