#### **Voting Information:**

As per **OFSAA Regulations:**

#### **Page R38, G) Amendments, Section 3 – Amendments to the Playing Regulations (per sport)**

- i. The Playing Regulations, as defined in these Regulations, are the sport specific rules of play at the various Championships and Festivals sponsored by the Federation. They are documented separately from these Regulations.
- ii. The Playing Regulations of the Federation can be amended by two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast (excluding abstentions) of the Representatives' Council. No Representatives' Council member shall have more than one vote.

#### **Eligible Voting members of the Representatives Council are:**

- a. One (1) male and one (1) female representative from each Member Association, as determined by each Association. All Association male and female representatives shall be currently employed teachers/administrators.
- b. Six (6) regional principal representatives who are selected by the Principals' Council at its Annual meeting. The six representatives must represent the six regions as identified in these By-laws.

## **ALPINE SKIING – 2 motions**

### **MOTION 1**

#### **MOTION ANDRAS/PASSI**

**Page A-5, Section 7 b. Sport Specific, ii.**

**WHEREAS** Section 7 b ii, states “In both the OFSAA Giant Slalom and Slalom competition, hard shell crash helmets (designed for Giant Slalom alpine ski racing) that provide complete head protection (front & back) and full ear protection are mandatory for all High School and Open competitors. FIS-approved slalom helmets which must have a chin guard attached to the helmet and which bear the following certification codes (CEE 1077, US 2040, or Snell S98 or R98) are permitted for OFSAA slalom-specific events only.”

**AND WHEREAS** OFSAA Alpine needs to remain consistent and compliant with current safety regulations in the sport of Alpine skiing.

**AND WHEREAS** the current codes in our playing regulations appear to be outdated as they are currently written in the OPHEA Safety Guidelines for Interschool Sports- Alpine skiing.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the playing regulations for OFSAA Alpine reflect this update and be replaced with the following:

7b ii - "In practice and competition, students must wear properly fitted Fédération Internationale de Ski (FIS) approved giant slalom helmets with full ear protection while in competitions and gate training environments. With the addition of a chin guard or mouth-guard when in slalom gate environments or a Fédération Internationale de Ski (FIS) approved slalom helmet with a chin guard attached to the helmet and bearing the following certification codes (ASTM F2040, CEN 1077, or Snell S98)."

1b) To determine the second entry, a school's place finishes in both the Slalom and Giant Slalom be added together with the lowest total being declared the winner. (ie school A places 1st and 3rd for a total of 4). Ties will be broken by adding together the team scores (ie School A scores 23 in GS and 41 in Slalom for a total of 64). The Association, on behalf of the school winning, is the recipient of the additional entry.

**AND WHEREAS:** The current language could leave limited time for student athletes to find some nutrition/hydration, potentially travel to a different venue through traffic, and complete a pre-game warm-up.

**AND WHEREAS:** Starting the 2.5h break at the *end* of the first game ensures adequate time for recovery and preparing to play a second game.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Section 1 (c) be replaced with the following: “A team shall play a maximum of two (2) games in one day and be entitled to two and one-half (2.5) hours between the **end** of one game and the start of the next game.”

**WHEREAS:** Players may stop, deflect and play the ball in a controlled manner in any part of the field, but it must be below shoulder height.

**AND WHEREAS:** The below shoulder height requirement is unique to OFSAA and the subjective variability, in terms of how it is enforced/interpreted by officials, is confusing to the student athletes, while doing little to diminish any of the perceived potential danger that it is intended to.

## **MOTION 3**

#### **Page G-3, Section 6 c. ii. – Rules and Officials**

**WHEREAS:** In the event of a tie at the end of a regulation time in any playoff game the first tie breaker is two (2) seven and a half (7.5) minute overtime periods (not sudden victory shall be played after a five (5)

minute rest. Teams will toss for choice of ends prior to the start of the overtime period. Teams will change ends with no rest after the first seven and a half (7.5) minute period. Then, it moves to a shoot-out competition if still tied.

**AND WHEREAS:** Eliminating the overtime periods and going straight to a shoot-out competition would be in alignment with FIH and other levels of field hockey which have already done so.

**AND WHEREAS:** The championship would remain on schedule while reducing fatigue and injury in student athletes all while preserving the integrity of the game.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** The first bullet point under Section 6. c. ii. be removed entirely and state:  
“ii. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time in any playoff game:

- Each team will select any five (5) players from those listed on the match sheet except a player who has received a red card or a temporary suspension at the end of the game. These five (5) players shall have a shoot-out competition if artificial turf is available. If not, teams will take penalty strokes alternately. A list should be provided within two (2) minutes after the end of the match and the shoot-out or penalty strokes will proceed from then. The first team to shoot being decided by a coin toss. The winner shall be the team scoring the most goals.
- If the score is still tied, a "sudden victory" system will be used with any five (5) players from those listed on the match sheet except a player who has received a red card or a temporary suspension at the end of the game or during the shoot-out. Each team will alternately send one player to take a shoot-out or penalty stroke until the tie is broken. The order of shoot-out or stroking will change with each pair of shoot-outs or penalty strokes. No player may take a second shot or stroke in this series until all five (5) players listed on the match sheet (except any under permanent suspension or temporary suspension at the end of overtime) have taken one stroke.”

#### **Page O-3, Section 6. b. i. – Rules and Officials - Playing Time**

**WHEREAS:** Section 6. b. i. currently states: “A game consists of (7) innings. The game ends if the team batting second has scored more runs in six innings before the third out in the last half of the seventh inning than the other team has scored in seven innings.”

**AND WHEREAS:** At the first Slo-Pitch Festival, there were some issues of games running very long which would be consistent across a lot of future Festival venues due to evening bookings.

**AND WHEREAS:** The Slo-Pitch SAC feels that a time limit of one hour and 15 minutes should be put in place as this is consistent with the Slo-Pitch Ontario guidelines and is actively in place in most Associations participating in Slo-Pitch.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Section 6. b. i. be edited to read: "A game consists of (7) innings. The game ends if the team batting second has scored more runs in six innings before the third out in the last half of the seventh inning than the other team has scored in seven innings. **No new inning will begin after one hour and fifteen minutes. This must be declared by the umpire at the start of the inning.**"

**AND WHEREAS:** The Official Rules of Slo-Pitch Ontario shall govern play at the OFSAA Festival, there is a chart that outlines various base distances that can be used for the high school age group.

**AND WHEREAS:** At the first Slo-Pitch Festival coaches meeting, there was lots of discussion surrounding the base distance and what would be used as they were using various ones in league play.

**AND WHEREAS:** Seventy feet in between the bases is outlined as an option in the Slo-Pitch Ontario Guidelines and is usually the standard set up for diamonds where bases are already secured.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** xi. be added to Section 6. b. and read: “The distance between the bases shall be seventy feet.”

## **MOTION 6**

### **MOTION ROULEAU/GIUDICE**

#### **Page O-4, Section 7. b. iv. – Uniforms and Equipment**

**WHEREAS:** Section 7. b. iv. states: “All bats used must adhere to the USSSA Licensed/Approved Bat Policy. To be legal, they must be marked with the “USSSA BPF 1.20” mark on its taper (known as the “Thumbprint”). These were made from 2012 to 2020 and meet the 220 lb compression testing. Manufacturers can make bats to meet the 220 lb compression standard but they can no longer have the USSSA Stamp. Beginning with 2021 Models, USSSA is using the new 240 lb compression standard with the NTS stamp (left). Moving forward, 240 lb bats are all that can be approved to have a USSSA Stamp on them.”

**AND WHEREAS:** Schools participating in the OFSAA Slo-Pitch Festival will be permitted to use bats that include a “Thumbprint.” This is standard in Slo-Pitch across Ontario and the new language will allow for further understanding and flexibility when purchasing equipment.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Section 7. b. iv. be edited to read: “All bats used must adhere to the USSSA Licensed/Approved Bat Policy. To be legal, they must be marked with the “USSSA BPF 1.20” mark on its taper (known as the “Thumbprint”). Both the 220 lbs and 240 lbs compression stamps will be accepted. See images below.”

Page R-2, Section 2 (f) (i) (ii) - Championship Structure and Procedures

**WHEREAS:** Section 2 (f) (ii) states that

(f) (ii) The time of the 35th place finisher from each event in the 2022-23 Championships shall be used as the qualifying time for the next OFSAA Championships.

**AND WHEREAS:** There were 9 events at the 2022-23 Championships that did not have a 35th place finisher and therefore the Swim SAC is unable to establish time standards for these events at this time. SAC is proposing that increasing the 2020 qualifying time standard by adding 8.8% will provide for a reasonable time standard for this year.

**AND WHEREAS:** There were 6 events which had 35th place finishers but whose qualifying time was at least 20% greater than the 2020 qualifying time. SAC believes that using these times would lead to an unreasonable number of entries in each of these events and therefore is proposing that the 8.8% being used in above situations be applied to these events as well.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Effective immediately, for the 2023-24 school year only, Section 2 (f) (ii) be replaced with the following:

2 (f) (ii) In events where there was no 35th place finishing time from the 2022-23 Championships, the qualifying time from the 2020 Championships plus 8.8% be used as the qualifying time for the 2023-24 Championships. As well, in events where there was a 35th place finisher but that time is more than 20% higher than the 2020 qualifying time, that the increase in the qualifying time for these events be limited to 8.8% as well.
