#### **Article 8 – Amendments**

##### **Section 1**

The Articles may be amended at the Annual Assembly in April, by two thirds (2/3) of the votes cast (excluding abstentions) of the entire membership (Executive Council, Representatives' Council, Presidents' Council, Principals' Council) No member shall have more than one vote.

#### **By-Law 9 – Amendments**

##### **Section 1**

- a) The By-Laws may be amended at the Annual Assembly by two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast (excluding abstentions) of the entire membership (Executive Council, Representatives' Council, Principals' Council, Presidents' Council). No member shall have more than one vote.

##### **Section 2**

- a) The Standing Rules – general sections of the Playing Regulations relevant to all Championships, (i.e Social, Awards, Uniform, Department, Supervision, Jury of Appeal, Competition Committee, etc.) other than the “Rules of Play”, governing competition in the various Championships sponsored by the Federation can be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast (excluding abstentions) of the entire Executive Council, Representatives' Council, Principals' Council, Presidents' Council). No member shall have more than one vote.

# 1 MOTION FROM AGM 2021

## MOTION 1

### MOTION POSTE/CHAMBERS

*A motion was presented at last year's Annual General Meeting regarding the number of votes each association receives at the AGM and Representatives' Council meetings. The motion was proposed by members of the Constitutional Review Committee.*

*At the 2021 AGM, the members voted to have the Future Directions Committee "review all associations and report back to the members". The Future Directions committee was provided with data on the number of schools and students in each association, and it supports the motion as presented at the 2021 AGM which would equalize the number of votes.*

**Page B3 Bylaw 2 Section 1 (a) and Page B5, Bylaw 3 – Committees, Section 1(i), and Page B6, Section 2(a).**

WHEREAS OFSAA strives for equity.

AND WHEREAS each Association is allowed only one entry to each Festival and Championship, with possible additional entries to fill the draw, based on previous Festival/Championship results, effective 2015.

AND WHEREAS TDSSAA was originally given 6 [3 females and 3 males] votes when 3 associations were merged in or around 2000. The merging of the associations was a result of the Ministry combining seven School Boards in the Toronto area into the Toronto District School Board January 1, 1998.

AND WHEREAS the number of schools and students was higher in TDSSAA at that time.

AND WHEREAS TDSSAA requested that number be reduced to 2 male and 2 female votes in 2008.

AND WHEREAS the number of schools of other associations are on par with TDSSAA (CWOSSA, EOSSAA, NCSSAA, ROPSSAA)

AND WHEREAS the enrolment numbers of other associations are now similar to TDSSAA (ROPSSAA, YRAA)

AND WHEREAS all Associations excluding TDSSAA currently each have one representative to each of the CGA and CBA.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Article 4 Section 2 (a) (i) read "One male and one female representative from each Association. All CBA and CGA representatives shall be currently employed teachers/administrators."

BIFRT Article 4 Section 4 (b) (ii) read "Each Association is entitled to one vote.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Bylaw 2 Section 1 (a) read: Each Association shall select one (1) male and one (1) female to serve on the Representatives' Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Page B5 – Bylaw 3 – Committees, Section 1a) (i) and Section 2a) (i) remove wording “the TDSSAA shall provide two representatives.”

###### **(a) Membership**

Athletic Coordinators of the established Associations of the Federation are members of the Athletic Coordinators’ Council. Associations are encouraged to attempt to have consistency in representation from year to year.

###### **(b) Duties**

Athletic Coordinators’ Council shall meet annually and shall be responsible to:

- (i) report to the AGM providing input on policies and direction of the Federation.
- (ii) participate as non-voting members of the AGM on all general motions.”

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the current Section 6 – Chief Executive Officer and the current Section 7 – Liability be renumbered Section 7 and Section 8.

**NOTE: If Motion #2 is defeated, Article motion 3, and Bylaw motions 2, 3, and 10, will be withdrawn)**

## **BYLAWS - 12 MOTIONS**

### **MOTION 1**

#### **MOVER POSTE/BLACKSHAW**

**Page B3, BY-LAW 2 – Selection and Term of Councillors (Representatives' Council, Executive Council, Principals' Council and Presidents' Council) Section 2 - Executive Council, a) Selection Representatives' Council Representatives**

WHEREAS each region is required to select a representative to the executive council.

AND WHEREAS in some cases in a given year there may be more than one person wanting to volunteer for a position on the executive council.

AND WHEREAS there is currently not a specific process in the by-laws for selection of a representative.

BE IT RESOVLED THAT By-law 2, Section 2 (a) be changed to read:

Representatives' Council Representatives - Six (6) individuals shall be confirmed annually at regional caucus sessions, held during the April meeting, from among the members of the Representatives' Council, to serve as the representatives to the Executive Council. These six (6) members shall be three (3) males and three (3) females and shall represent the six (6) regions (North [NWOSSAA, NEOAA, NOSSA], South [GHAC, ROPSSAA, SOSSA], East [COSSA, B4 EOSSAA, NCSSAA], West [CWOSSA, SWOSSAA, WOSSAA], Central [GBSSA, LOSSA, YRAA], Metro [TDCAA, TDSSAA, CISAA]). Each individual selected to serve as a member of the Executive Council shall be a member of the College of Teachers.

The following rotation for selecting regional representatives to the Executive Council shall be in place:

2022-2023 school year North and West to select.

2023-2024 school year South and East to select.

2024-2025 school year Metro and Central to select.

and this rotational sequence shall be followed in coming years.

In rotational years involving the North and West, the North shall select first in even years and the West shall select first in odd years. An election shall take place if more than one representative wishes to serve. The region that selects second shall select a representative of the opposite gender of the other region.

In rotational years involving the South and East, the South shall select first in odd years and the East shall select first in even years. An election shall take place if more than one representative wishes to

serve. The region that selects second shall select a representative of the opposite gender of the other region.

In rotational years the Metro and Central, the Central shall select first in even years and the Metro shall select first in odd years. An election shall take place if more than one representative wishes to serve. The region that selects second shall select a representative of the opposite gender of the other region.

**Page B21, By-law 5, - ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION - section 4 – Individuals – (g)The Federation's Transfer Policy**

*A motion from last year's AGM was referred back to the Board of Reference – Transfers for consideration. The motion in question would have allowed for exemptions for students transferring schools for mental health reasons. The motion required the student to present documentation to support their application including a treatment plan from a mental health professional.*

*There was discussion at the AGM about the required documentation. An amendment was defeated that would have removed the requirement for any and all documentation as well as the requirement that students must attend their next closest school unless otherwise stated in the treatment plan.*

*The Board of Reference – Transfers reconsidered the motion and is proposing the following amended motion. This follows the wishes of the members at last year's AGM to still require documentation from a mental health professional, but removes the treatment plan requirement.*

WHEREAS there is currently no section in the transfer policy to allow for eligibility in cases where a treatment plan designed by a mental health professional recommends a student transfer schools for mental health reasons;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT a new section d (vi) be added to the transfer policy which shall read:

The student has transferred schools as a result of the recommendation of a regulated mental health professional with education and training to assess, diagnose, and treat mental health conditions

(psychiatrist, psychologist, and/or clinical psychiatric nurse). Prior to transferring, the student must have been diagnosed with a mental health condition and be undergoing treatment by the regulated mental health professional. Documentation must be provided by the mental health professional confirming the student is receiving treatment and indicating the reason a change in schools will assist the student in their treatment plan and recovery. Unless otherwise confirmed in writing by the mental health professional, the student must attend the next closest school to their home residence if remaining in the same system. If changing systems, the students must attend the designated school according to school board boundaries (or is the closest school to the student's home residence if no school boundaries exist). If the independent school is faith-based, the student must attend the closest independent school of that particular faith.

**Page B26, By-Law 5, ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION, Section 4 Individuals – (g)The Federation's Transfer Policy, Note 6**

**WHEREAS** students who are part of an exchange program are the only students who are afforded the privilege of not requiring transfer to participate.

**AND WHEREAS** there are many other students in situations that would require an exemption to the transfer policy (i.e. refugees new to Canada).

**AND WHEREAS** there are categories available for exchange students to apply under.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Note 6 is deleted from the OFSAA Transfer Policy.

**Page B 34, By-Law 9 – Amendments**

**WHEREAS** the pandemic has required organizations to adjust their ways of operating;

**AND WHEREAS** at the 2021 AGM a motion was carried that allowed the executive council to make adjustments to the by-laws and playing regulations as the result of the pandemic.

**AND WHEREAS** this allowed OFSAA to be responsive and efficient as issues arose.

**AND WHEREAS** those adjustments may need to be done for the 2022-23 school year in a timely manner, and involving the various decision-making bodies could prove inefficient;

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the following be added immediately after BY-LAW 9 – AMENDMENTS and before Section 1:

The executive council shall have the authority, if it deems necessary, to make amendments to the by-laws and playing regulations (general sections and sport-specific), when those amendments are



necessary or desirable for reasons related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Such amendments require a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the votes actually cast by the executive council and shall apply for the 2022-23 school year only.

**PAGE: B51, Appendix VII – Championship and Festival Criteria and Requirements**

WHEREAS the current championship/festival criteria limit the amount of years an OFSAA event can remain festival status;

AND WHEREAS Girls’ Golf, Football, Snowboarding, and Field Lacrosse have maintained festival status for more than five years;

AND WHEREAS those sports that no longer meet festival status should have longer than 1 year to increase participation back to festival status;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the following two statements be removed from the Championship/Festival Criteria and Requirements:

**“A sport in this situation shall remain a festival for a maximum of five years provided it meets festival status. After five years, if the sport does not meet championship criteria, it will no longer operate under OFSAA jurisdiction.”**

And

**“New sports which have festival status will have a maximum of five years to meet championship criteria or will no longer operate under OFSAA jurisdiction.”**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the second bullet of Appendix VII shall read:

**Sports which have festival status and do not meet the criteria, shall have 3 consecutive years to meet the criteria or will no longer operate under OFSAA jurisdiction.**

**Page B17, By-Law 5 – Section 1(b) - Eligibility for Competition**

WHEREAS in an effort to increase the transparency of both the entry commitment process and additional entry process;

AND WHEREAS the additional entry process was removed as a standing rule within the OFSAA playing regulations;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT a new Appendix XVI be adopted as follows:

**Appendix XVI**

To facilitate additional entries required for OFSAA team sports, the following process will be followed:

1. Associations shall submit entry commitments by the deadline dates stated in By-Law 5, Section 1(b).
2. OFSAA will request that associations confirm the accuracy of submitted entry commitments no later than three (3) school days after the deadline dates stated in By-Law 5, Section 1(b).
3. To facilitate the draws, additional entries in the Federation Championships and Festivals shall be selected from:
  - (i) the gold medal Association of the previous year;
  - (ii) the silver medal Association of the previous year;
  - (iii) the bronze medal Association of the previous year;
  - (iv) the antique bronze medal Association of the previous year.

To further facilitate the draws, entries may be awarded to the association medalists from two years' prior, provided that the additional entries to the previous year's association medalists have been exhausted. Additional entries shall be selected from:

- (i) the gold medal Association of two years prior;
- (ii) the silver medal Association of two years prior;
- (iii) the bronze medal Association of two years prior;
- (iv) the antique bronze medal Association of two years prior;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the last statement in By-Law 5, section 1(b) be changed to read the following:

Additional entries for team sports as identified in By-Law 4, Section 1(a), shall be determined by OFSAA as outlined in Appendix XVI and conditional upon confirmation of the OFSAA office.

AND WHEREAS: the integrity of the qualification process for OFSAA should be held to a high standard;

AND WHEREAS: removing alternate means of qualifying for OFSAA will encourage associations to grow the sport and establish a championship or qualifying event;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: all corresponding sections of 5(a) of the playing regulations listed above, will read as follows and take effect during the 2023-2024 school year:

**Participate in the Association Championship or an OFSAA qualifying event.**

WHEREAS if Girls' Slo-Pitch has been approved as an OFSAA festival as per motions put forward at the 2022 AGM, the attached Girls' Slo-Pitch playing regulations be adopted as draft for the 2022-2023 school year.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the attached Girls' Slo-Pitch playing regulations be added to the OFSAA constitution. **See attached draft playing regulations**

#### MOTION 1

##### MOTION MACDOUGALL/KIRBY

**Page V-1, Section 1 (b)(i) - Events and/or Classifications**

**Page V-3, Section 3 (f) - Entry**

**Page V-4, Section 6(a)(i) - Rules and Officials**

WHEREAS safety is the first priority for all our student-athletes. The current girls' weight class categories present a significant and unnecessary risk for the girls' wrestling between 83 and 115 kg. The addition of the 89 and 95kg weight classes will reduce the chance of injury to the lighter weight student-athletes.

AND WHEREAS to ensure equitable opportunities for all student-athletes, adding the 3 weight classes to the girls' division (38kg, 89kg, 95kg) ensures girls and boys the same opportunities to compete.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Page V-1, Section 1 (b)(i) be changed to read as follows:

(b) Girls' Events

(i) **Seventeen (17)** weight classes will be conducted: **38**, 41, 44, 47.5, 51, 54, 57.5, 61, 64, 67.5, 72, 77, 83, **89, 95**, 115, OVER 115 "kgs.

(ii) In order to compete in the 115 kg class, a competitor must weigh in over **95 kg** and in order to compete in the highest weight class, a competitor must weigh in over 115 kg.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following weight classes be added to section 3(f): 38, 89, and 95 kg.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED section 6(a)(i) be changed to read as follows:

Boys': 38, 41, 44, 47.5, 51, 54, 57.5, 61, 64, 67.5, 72, 77, 83, 89, 95, 130, OVER 130 kg

WHEREAS safety is the first priority for all our athletes. Ensuring athletes are well prepared and follow the practice requirements set out by OFSAA's playing regulations, and not be participating for the purpose of acclaiming place points due to low entry numbers. Recommending that place points be prorated based on entry numbers per weight division **is fair for determining championship awards.**

AND WHEREAS to ensure we provide equitable opportunities for all athletes to earn points for their respective teams, and provide a fair allocation of place points given the amount of entries in each weight division.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT section 6(b)(iv) be changed to read as follows:

Place points are 24, 18, 13, 9, 6, 4 **and will only be awarded if 17 or more wrestlers are entered in a weight division. 13, 9, 6, 4, 2, 1 will be awarded if 9 - 16 wrestlers are entered in a weight division. 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 will be awarded if 8 or less wrestlers are entered in a weight division.** Winners of the third and fifth place bouts can only receive consolation round win points.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT replace section 6(b)(i) of the playing regulations with the following:

(i) The top **seventeen (17)** boy wrestlers may score points for a team. The top **seventeen (17)** girl wrestlers may score points for a team.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that section 2 (a) & (b) within the sport specific directives are replaced with one subsection and read as follows:

(a) The top **seventeen (17)** boy wrestlers may score points for a team. The top **seventeen (17)** girl wrestlers may score points for a team.
